# Preparation for pet ownership

He has no desire for a particular breed of dog and whilst he would like a younger dog it doesn't need to be a puppy.

He's keen to give a home to a dog that needs it, and has looked at multiple rescue centres online, including Woodgreen, but found that he gets little response and that most of the dogs require a home with no young children, so has widened his search to include people looking to re-home their dogs through pet websites and social media.

Whilst he see's himself as experienced with dogs he has been researching local dog training classes and sees this as a fun way to get the children involved when the time comes.





# **Challenges**

Knows that some of the people advertising dogs for rehoming might be unethical owners or stolen dogs and is keen to know how to avoid these people.

Whilst he's not attached to a particular breed he wants to make sure that the dog they get is the right fit for his family so is looking for a good source of information on breeds and their characteristics.

# Views on animal welfare
