- Sample of relinquishment requests for 1158 cats from 895 owners
 - Approx. October 2021 5th September 2022 dates not saved for first 200 entries
- 700 single cat homes
- 195 multi-cat homes
- 458 cats live in multi-cat households

Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD)

The IMD combines information from the seven domains to produce an overall relative measure of deprivation.

The domains are combined using the following weights:

- Income Deprivation (22.5%)
- Employment Deprivation (22.5%)
- Education, Skills and Training Deprivation (13.5%)
- Health Deprivation and Disability (13.5%)
- o Crime (9.3%)
- Barriers to Housing and Services (9.3%)
- Living Environment Deprivation (9.3%)

1= 10% most deprived, 10 = 10% least deprived



Does this differ with IMD decile?

51% of owners in decile 1 (most deprived areas) seek pet advice online.

For other deciles this is 30% or less.

24% of owners in decile 1 seek pet advice through a vet/nurse.

For other deciles, this is at least 36%

Reasons for Relinquishment

- 1) III health of owner
- 2) Change of circumstances, unable to care for
- 3) Emigrating or moving home

When all behaviour related categories are combined this becomes the 2nd most frequent reason = 18.05%

Those stating that their pet has behavioural issues are asked what the main issue is...






- Financial reasons only feature in the top 3 reasons for relinquishment in decile 1 (most deprived area)



Breed

- Difficult to accurately report due to inconsistencies in the data e.g. spelling, naming conventions
- O Breed not reported or unknown in 549 (47.41%) cases
- 351 cats reported as Domestic shorthair (30.31%)
- 119 cats reported as mixed breed (10.28%)
- Top 3 named breeds
 - British Shorthair
 - Bengal
 - Ragdoll












Is your cat neutered?

Unsurprisingly, too many pets or unexpected litters are the most common reason for kitten intake requests

Sadly for senior cats, owner illness or death accounts for 46.15% of relinquishment requests




22.06% of cats owned for less than a month were acquired as strays



Length of ownership and reason for relinquishment

14.71% of requests to relinquish a cat after less than a month of ownership cited financial reasons

25.71% of requests to relinquish a cat owned for 6-12 months reported their circumstances had changed and they were unable to care for their pet

Cats owned for 10 years+ relinquished due to moving/emigrating (23.62%) or owner illness or death (37.01%)





Vets, Vaccs, Neutering and Chips

- 51.88% of cats that have been seen by a vet are vaccinated
- 10.36% of cats that are not registered with a vet or have never visited the vets are vaccinated
- 82.81% of cats that have been seen by a vet are neutered
- 37.75% of cats that are not registered with a vet or have never visited the vets are neutered
- 70.33% of cats that have been seen by a vet are microchipped
- 22.07% of cats that are not registered with a vet or have never visited the vets are microchipped



Neutering, Vaccinations and Microchipping

- 43.27% of neutered cats are vaccinated
- 20.55% of unneutered cats are vaccinated
- 72.60% of neutered cats are microchipped
- 0 10.12% of unneutered cats are microchipped

Indoor and Outdoor = 65.91% 80.36% neutered




Outdoor only = 1.19% 72.73% neutered

IMD and Access
